



SCENIC FLIGHT OFFERS

PRIVATE FLIGHTS

THE HELICOPTER WELCOME ABOARD.

Today, you will be flying in an Airbus AS350B3e helicopter. The B3e seats five passengers and a pilot, and is mainly used for high level missions in mountainous area. The B3e's comfortable cabin will allow you to fully enjoy the spectacular views of Europe's highest peaks.



1/DISCOVER MONT BLANC AND SHOP IN CHAMONIX (flight time: 60 min.)

PRICE CHF 3,500 [5 PASSENGERS MAXIMUM PER HELICOPTER]



Fly from Geneva Airport, over the city and its famous Water Jet fountain, and onwards to the Mont Blanc and the Arve Valley.

This flight will take you past the Graian Alps, the range of Europe's tallest peaks, then on to the Dome du Goûter and the top of Mont Blanc, before veering past the Argentière Glacier and the Aiguilles Rouges.

The helicopter then makes its approach above the glacier and lands at the Argentière helipad, where a van awaits to drive you to Chamonix for a 2-hour shopping trip. The flight back to Geneva Airport takes you over French portion of the Chablais region, with its splendid views of Lake Geneva.

* If you wish, you can have lunch at the "Ferme du Tornieux", which faces Mont Blanc, instead of landing at Argentière. Please note that the lunch is not included in the price of the tour.

2/THE MAJESTIC GLACIER DU TRIENT & MONT BLANC (flight time: 70 min.)

PRICE CHF 4,000 [5 PASSENGERS MAXIMUM PER HELICOPTER]



Fly from Geneva Airport, out over the city and its famous Water Jet fountain, and on to Mont Blanc and the Arve Valley.

Land on the Trient Glacier and take in the breathtaking panorama while sipping a glass of chilled champagne at an altitude of 3,260 metres!

The flight back to Geneva Airport will take you over the French portion of the Chablais region, with its splendid views of Lake Geneva.



3/SHOPPING IN GSTAAD VIA GLACIER 3000 (flight time: 80 min.)

PRICE CHF 4,380 (5 PASSENGERS MAXIMUM PER HELICOPTER)



Fly directly from Geneva, over the city's famous Water Jet fountain, and head east for 20 minutes over Lake Geneva and toward Montreux.

The Col de Jaman is the next highlight on your ride. On your right, you will see the small train that goes up the Rochers de Naye, a 2,042-metre- high mountain and the gateway to the Bernese Oberland.

Land on Glacier 3000 and take in the superb view of the Northern Alps while sipping a glass of chilled Champagne. Then fly on to Saanen Airport where a vehicle will be waiting to drive you to Gstaad for a 2-hour afternoon shopping trip.

The flight back to Geneva will take you over Lake Geneva's southern shore and the Lavaux region with its terraces, which were made a UNESCO World Heritage Site in July 2007.



4/LUNCH AT GRUYÈRES & SHOPPING IN MONTREUX (flight time: 60 min.)

PRICE CHF 3,500 [5 PASSENGERS MAXIMUM PER HELICOPTER]



Enjoy a 60-minute flight from Geneva Airport to Gruyères, a charming Swiss village surrounded by mountains. During your flight, admire the stunning views of the Val de Charmey and Lake Geneva.

After landing at Gruyères, marvel at the village's authentic Swiss architecture and enjoy a lunch of local specialities at one of its many restaurants.

After lunch, our pilot will fly you over the mountains to Montreux, a town on Lake Geneva where you can wander around and shop to your heart's content before heading back to Geneva.

Please note that the lunch is not included in the price of the tour.



5/LAKE ANNECY (EUROPE'S CLEAREST LAKE) & THE PLATEAU DES GLIÈRES (flight time: 60 min.)

PRICE CHF 3,500 (5 PASSENGERS MAXIMUM PER HELICOPTER)



The Northern Alps are flanked by beautiful lakes. Our scenic flight over Lake Annecy and the surrounding area will be etched on your mind forever. This flight departs from Geneva Airport, over the city and its famous Water Jet fountain, and south to the Salève, the "Balcony of Geneva".

You then fly over the Glières Plateau and the Aravis range an important site of the French Resistance during World War 2, and down to Lake Annecy via Old Annecy, before crossing the lake between the towns of Menthon-Saint-Bernard, with its impressive 10th-century castle, and Talloires.

You then continue on to Saint-Jorioz, with Annecy on your right, and back up to Geneva.
